MISSION MOMENTS: World Health Day - In a poor village in Haiti, one-year-old Marcellus was losing weight rapidly and had a persistent cough. His mother could not afford to take him to the closest health facility. Hope came in the form of a mobile clinic supported by PWS&D and other Canadian Foodgrains Bank members. There, Marcellus received a food supplement, antibiotics and multivitamins. He is no longer malnourished and is on course to grow up healthy and strong.

Clarifying note about 'members' and 'adherents'

Sometimes these terms can be confusing. When a person comes to Dayspring (or any Presbyterian Church in Canada congregation for that matter), you can be part of one of two – actually three – descriptions. Let's start with the third one: This is the *covenant member*, which is any child, who has been baptized (being within the covenant), and who hasn't professed their faith publicly.

A *member* is a person who has professed their faith publicly, either at Dayspring, or another congregation from which they have been transferred and formally welcomed during a worship service.

Adherents are persons who haven't professed their faith publicly (yet) and who still see themselves as part of our faith community.

Members, as two examples, may vote at Annual Meetings of the congregation as well as when elders are elected.

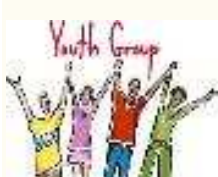

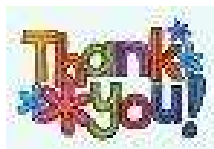
We are also looking for volunteers to provide **snacks** for the **Thursday, Friday, and Saturday** workers.

Dayspring is partnering with the Breakfast program at Richard Secord School



As part of our "immediate neighbourhood" mission initiative, our Mission and Outreach Ministry Team is working through a number of possible projects with the principal and with Darolyn McCrostie as the liaison. Late last year, the school initiated a breakfast program in response to an awareness that many children are coming to school hungry. Cobb's Bakery is providing the bread for this program and Dayspring has been asked to provide jam and margarine. Since December, certain individual members of the congregation have been providing the margarine and jam for this program. We now only need jam until the end of June 2019. It needs to be **gelatin free** as many of the students are Muslim, and free of entire strawberries as many of the students don't like "chunks". **The No Frills generic strawberry jam or raspberry**, exactly fits the bill and we ask that you look for one with a lengthy expiry date. *We are now broadening this initiative to involve the whole congregation.* We are suggesting the next two communion Sundays (**May 5 and June 2**), families bring one or more jars of jam and place it in the space provided as a special offering for the needs of the children at Richard Secord. Thank you for helping.
