# Richard Secord Breakfast Program (monthly)

For many years, DPC congregation members have donated jam and margarine to the breakfast program at Richard Secord Elementary School, of which 80-100 children participate. Due to Covid restrictions, we were required to switch to individually packaged items, i.e. cheese strings, yogurt tubes and granola bars. To support this initiative, mark your (special) offering envelopes with 'Breakfast Program'.

Since October 2020, we began making monthly deliveries to the school with orders worth \$100-\$300. Our Fellowship Ministry generously donated \$500 towards this initiative and along with some other individual cash donations, we continue to support them in this way. Our activity and contacts have garnered more support for Secord in two ways:

- When we put in our orders to No Frills on 40<sup>th</sup> Ave, the owners, Matt & Ashley, have joined in the initiative by giving us gift cards that cover between 25-50% of our order.
- Greenfield Community Church has also been collecting individual food items from their congregation and have already delivered two significant orders, as well.

In June of 2020, our three neighbourhood churches partnered together and acquired a provincial government grant to support those who have been negatively impacted by the pandemic. In the last 7 months, we have accomplished:

- 12,000 muffins have been baked for the innercity shelters run by the Mustard Seed
- Grocery gift cards have helped 306 people in need
- 82 servings of Christmas turkey dinner delivered to recipients' doors
- 180 masks were hand-sewn and donated to the inner-city community
- 200 isolated seniors received care packages
- 150 teachers received an encouragement coffee voucher (this was a joint venture with Square One)



One of the ongoing projects done by **Greenfield Community Church** involves collecting donations of used cotton or cotton/polyester bed sheets (fitted, flat or duvet covers, any size) and/or pillowcases. These items are then re-purposed into bandages or 'gauze' for hospitals in Cameroon through the North American Baptist/Alberta Baptist Association.
